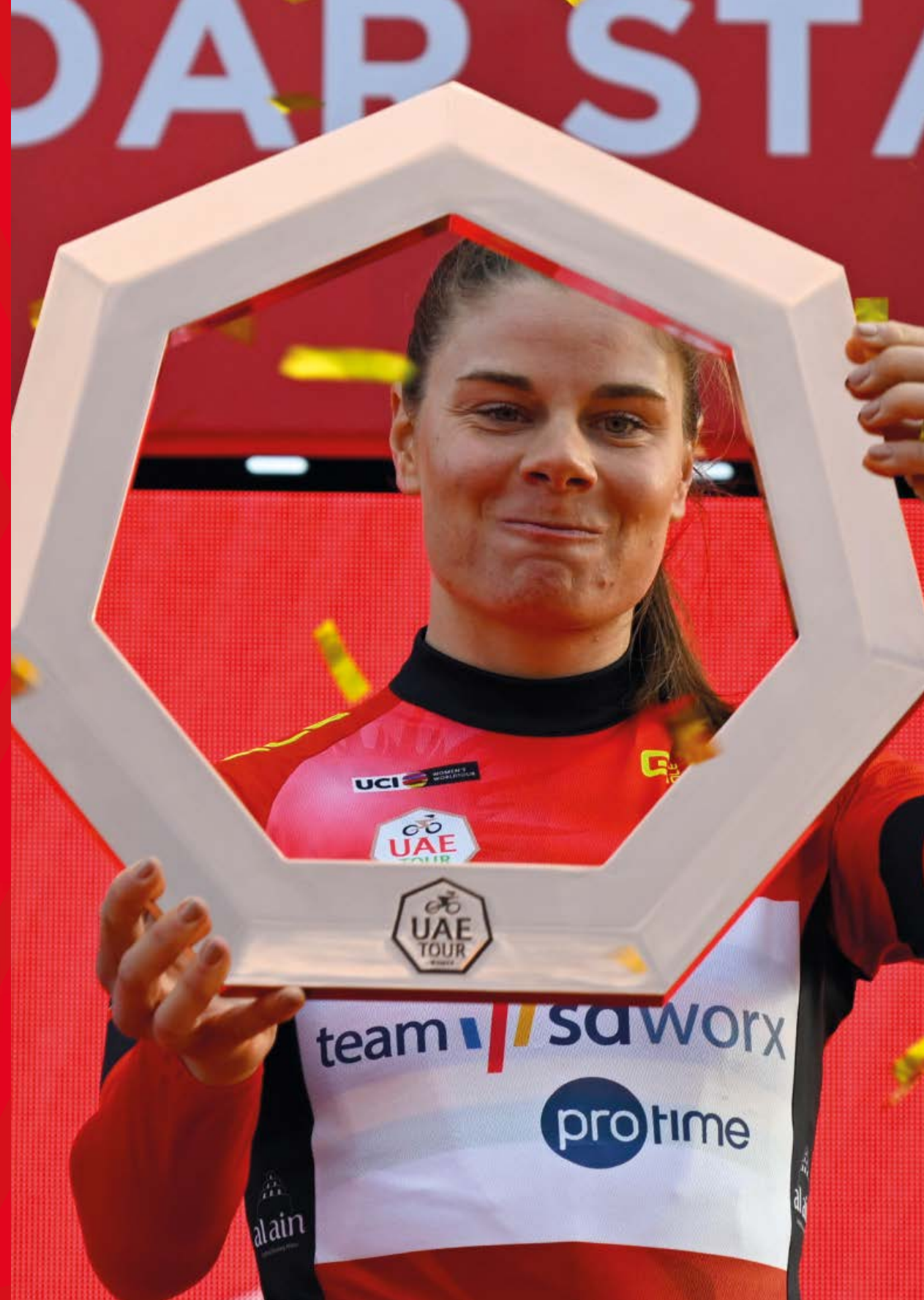
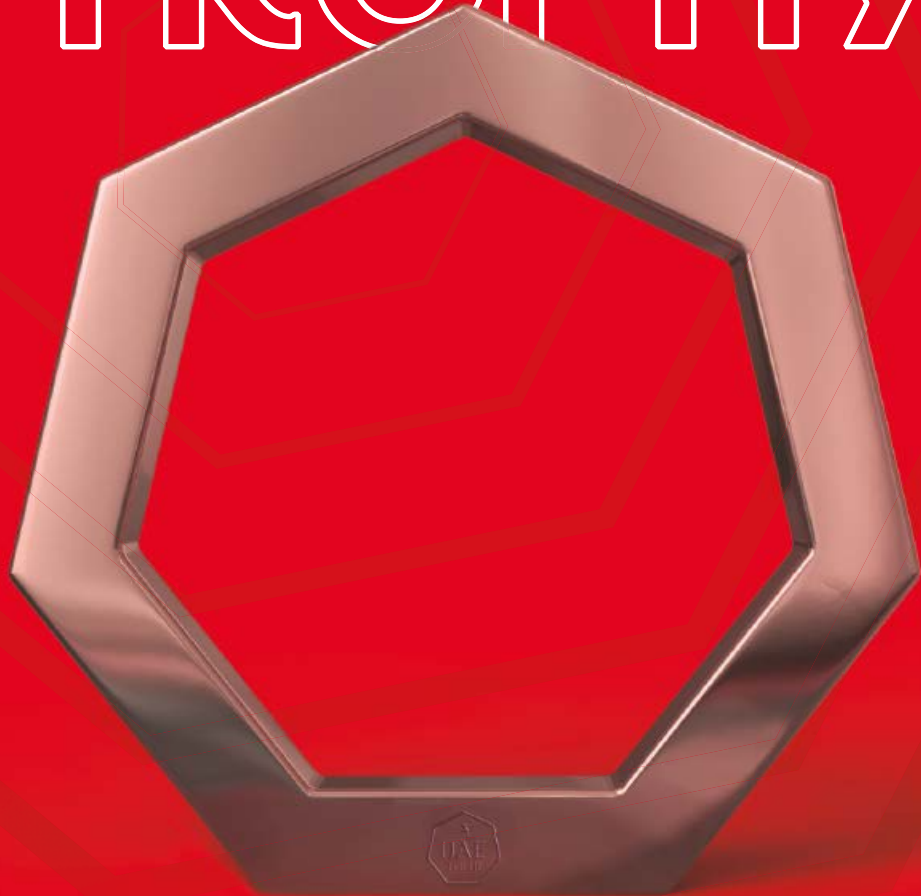

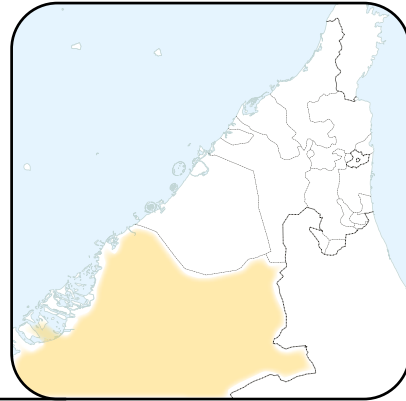

ABU DHABI



Abu Dhabi is the largest Emirate in the UAE, occupying 84% of the national landmass territory. It has 200 islands and a long coastline stretching across 700 km. Its total area is 67,340 km².

Abu Dhabi City in the Emirate is the federal capital of the UAE.

LOCATION AND GEOGRAPHY

The Emirate of Abu Dhabi lies on the coast of the Arabian Gulf and is bordered by the Sultanate of Oman to the east, the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia to the south and west, and the Emirate of Dubai to the northeast. The three main regions of the Emirate are the city of Abu Dhabi, Al Ain in the east, and Al Dhafrah in the west. In the eastern region, to the south of Al Ain city is Jebel Hafeet - the Emirate's highest peak (1,240 m).

Al Dhafrah has seven main cities: Liwa, Madinat Zayed, Ghayathi, Ruwais, Mirfa, Sila and Delma Island.

The city of Abu Dhabi is connected to the mainland by four bridges: Maqta bridge, Mussafah bridge, Sheikh Zayed bridge and Sheikh Khalifa bridge.

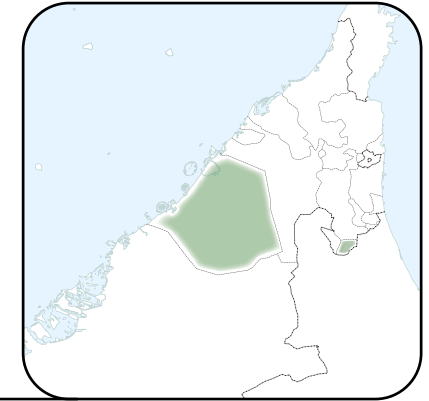
TOURISTIC IMPORTANCE

Abu Dhabi has become a centre for world-class sporting events such as the Abu Dhabi Golf Championship, the prestigious Abu Dhabi Desert Challenge cross-country rally and the Formula One Abu Dhabi Grand Prix.

Additionally, the city houses the world's largest concentration of premier cultural institutions which includes the Sheikh Zayed National Museum, the Guggenheim Abu Dhabi and Louvre Abu Dhabi.

Abu Dhabi is rich in natural wonders, too. While the famous Liwa Oasis in the south of the Emirate is home to some of the largest and most beautiful sand dunes in the world, the garden city of Al Ain in the foothills of Jebel Hafeet is home to several heritage sites.

DUBAI



Dubai is the second largest Emirate with an area of 4,114 km², which is about 5% of the UAE without the islands.

The older districts of Dubai cover an area of 1,500 m². The Emirate has earned the titles of 'Pearl of the Gulf' and 'Jewel of the World' because of its heritage and history.

LOCATION AND GEOGRAPHY

Dubai is located on the eastern coast of the Arabian Peninsula, in the southwest corner of the Arabian Gulf. It shares its boundaries with Abu Dhabi in the south and Sharjah in the northeast. It shares its international border with the Sultanate of Oman in the southeast. Dubai is roughly 16m or 52ft above sea level.

Dubai City is the capital of the Emirate. It is characterized by its historic creek, which divides the city into Deira in the north and Bur Dubai in the south

In 2016, a new addressing system was launched which involved dividing the Emirate into 14 districts.

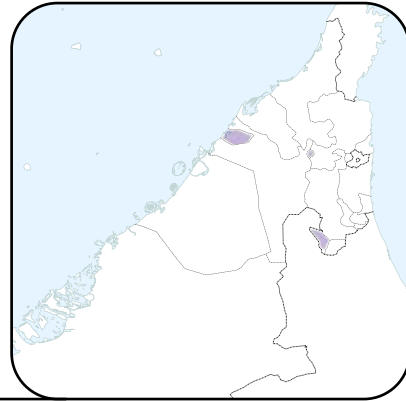
Dubai has several sandy beaches on its western side, a mangrove at the eastern end of the creek, many deserts in the interior and western regions, and wadis in the Hatta region.

TOURISM

Dubai boasts a wide variety of world-class hotels, modern architecture, entertainment and dining venues, traditional markets, shopping centres and sporting event locations.

Some of the major tourist attractions in the Emirate are the wadis of Hatta, the sail-shaped Burj Al Arab hotel, which is also the world's only seven-star hotel, and Burj Khalifa, which is the world's tallest skyscraper.

AJMAN



Ajman is the smallest of the seven Emirates, measuring about 260 km², which is about 0.3% of the UAE's area without the islands. Ajman has a few sandy beaches but is mainly characterised by the rugged Hajjar mountain range. Although Ajman City is modern and provides modern services through digital channels, it still retains its traditional charm.

LOCATION AND GEOGRAPHY

Ajman lies on the coast of the Arabian Gulf, in the northern part of the UAE. It is 16 km long and lies between the Emirates of Sharjah and Umm Al Quwain.

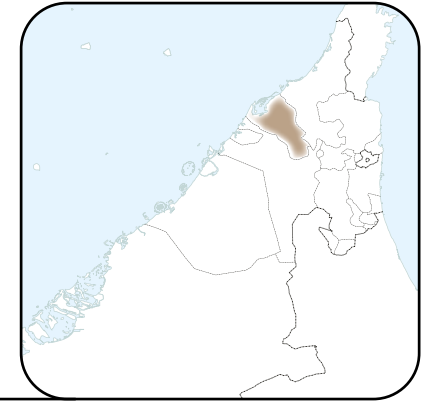
CULTURE AND HERITAGE

Ajman Fort is one of the country's historic landmarks, dating back to the 18th century. The fort has been restored and transformed into a museum. It contains archaeological discoveries and evidence of civilizations from different historic eras.

TOURISTIC LANDMARKS

The magical beaches of Ajman with their fresh air, peaceful environment and clean water play host to a range of marine activities which attract many sea lovers. Some of the major landmarks in Ajman are Ajman Museum, Masfout Castle, Masfout Gate, and the Red Fort.

UMM AL QUWAIN



Umm Al Quwain is the second smallest and the least populated Emirate in the UAE. It covers an area of approximately 720 km², which is equivalent to 1% of the UAE's area.

LOCATION AND GEOGRAPHY

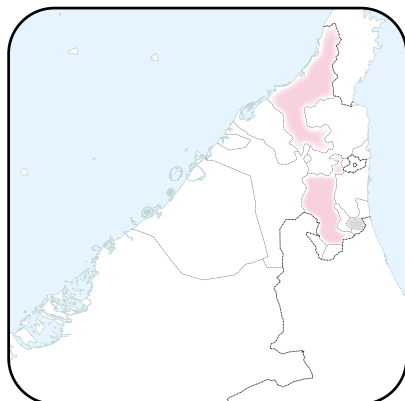
Umm Al Quwain is situated between Sharjah to the southwest and Ras Al Khaimah to the northeast. The city of Umm Al Quwain is built on a narrow peninsula called Khor Al Bidiyah.

TOURISTIC IMPORTANCE

The Emirate is famous for coastal mangroves on the coast of Arabian Gulf and many islands that lie to the east of the mainland. The biggest island, Al Seniah, is home to Arabian gazelles, falcons and turtles.

Umm Al Quwain provides facilities for numerous recreational activities, from sailing to skydiving. Traditional activities such as dhow building and sports such as falconry and camel racing are also popular in the Emirate. Dreamland Aqua Park, the UAE's largest water park and resort, attracts several visitors.

RAS AL KHAIMAH



Ras Al Khaimah is the fourth-largest Emirate and covers an area of 1,684 km², which is equal to 3.16% of the total area of the UAE.

LOCATION AND GEOGRAPHY

Ras Al Khaimah is located near the northernmost point of the UAE and shares its boundaries with the Emirates of Umm Al Quwain, Fujairah and Sharjah. It shares its international border with the Sultanate of Oman.

The city of Ras Al Khaimah is the capital of the Emirate. A creek divides it into two areas: the western old town of Ras Al Khaimah and the eastern part - Al Nakheel. Other key towns are Al Jazirah Al Hamra, Digdaga, Khatt and Masafi. Masafi shares its boundaries with the Emirate of Fujairah and is known for its mineral water. Al Marjan Island, to the south of the Emirate, is a group of four coral-shaped, man-made islands offering hospitality, residential and lifestyle attractions.

Ras Al Khaimah has a strategic geographical location, stretching along the shore of the Arabian Gulf, adjacent to the Strait of Hormuz.

TOURIST ATTRACTIONS

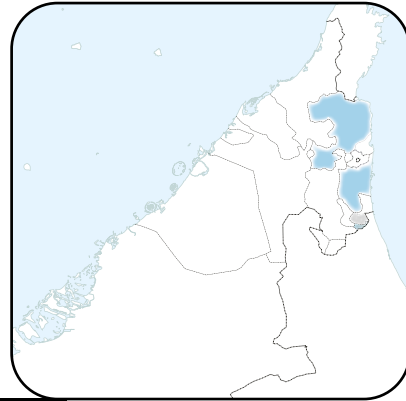
Ras Al Khaimah is an up-and-coming tourism hub. It has scenic locations with diverse landscapes, including rolling sand dunes, coastal strips, salt flats, mangroves and mountains. There are sulfur springs near the mountain areas and the Emirate is also home to a diverse range of wildlife that includes foxes, jerboas and hundreds of bird species.

The highest peak in the UAE, Jebel Jais, is in Ras Al Khaimah. Standing 1,934 m high, it is the site of the world's longest zipline certified by Guinness World Records. The site also offers several other adventure attractions and has the highest restaurant in the UAE. Ras Al Khaimah was named Gulf Tourism Capital for both 2020 and 2021 by the Gulf Cooperation Council.

Visit the Department of Antiquities and Museums for a glimpse of the history of the Emirate and the Ras Al Khaimah Tourism Development Authority for more information on its tourist attractions.



FUJAIRAH



Fujairah is the only Emirate that is located completely on the eastern coast of the UAE along the Gulf of Oman. The shores of Fujairah extend along the Gulf of Oman for about 70 km from the city of Fujairah in the south to the town of Dibba in the far north. The total area of the Emirate of Fujairah is 1,450 km².

LOCATION AND GEOGRAPHY

It shares its boundaries with the Emirates of Sharjah and Ras Al Khaimah on the west and the Emirate of Sharjah to the south. On the north, it shares its international border with the Sultanate of Oman.

TOURISTIC ATTRACTIONS

Fujairah is distinguished by its rugged mountains, valleys, waterfalls, oases and wide sandy beaches. It has several hot, cold and mineral springs.

Because of its easterly location, Fujairah's climate is more moderate than that of Abu Dhabi and Dubai. Weekend visitors looking to escape the heat are drawn to Fujairah's relaxed and peaceful atmosphere.

Wadi Al Wurayah waterfalls and Ain Al Madhab Gardens are major touristic attractions, as are the historic Al Bidya Mosque and the Heritage Village.

DUBAI POLICE OFFICER'S CLUB

The Dubai Police Officers' Club, centrally located, fosters community among officers. It offers modern amenities like fitness centers and sports facilities, promoting camaraderie and work-life balance. Additionally, it facilitates professional growth and networking, embodying Dubai's dedication to its law enforcement's welfare and unity.

DUBAI POLICE STADIUM

The Police Officers' Club Stadium, also known as the Dubai Municipal Stadium, is a versatile venue in Dubai, UAE. With a capacity of 7,500 spectators, it primarily hosts football matches.

DUBAI CREEK

Dubai Creek, a saltwater inlet, flows through Dubai's core, connecting the Gulf trading port to Ras al Khor bird sanctuary. Historically, it anchored the fishing and pearling industry, shaping the city's economy. Today, the creek's eastern and western banks link via a tunnel and four bridges, though traditional ferry boats still ply its waters.

DUBAI CREEK PARK

Situated along Dubai Creek, Creek Park distinguishes itself with its waterfront location. As the city's second largest park, it boasts expansive acres adorned with botanical gardens and children's play areas. Despite its central location, visitors can relish serene lawns and panoramic water vistas. A paved promenade offers tranquil strolls, while theater shows and bike rentals enhance the experience. With numerous free barbecue spots, it's a favorite destination for picnickers.

AL SEEF DISTRICT

It is a tourist project located within Dubai Creek in the Al Fahidi neighborhood. The project extends over a distance of 1.8 km from the Dubai Creek beach occupying an estimated area of 2.5 million square feet. Opened in 2017, the project consists of two main sections - a heritage section that reflects the old architectural style, along with a contemporary section that includes new and modern buildings. Both sections include a variety of options for restaurants, cafes and shops. The project includes 500 stores and restaurants and three hotels divided between a

heritage hotel with 200 rooms, along with a couple of modern hotels with 150 and 200 rooms, respectively. In addition, there is the availability of water taxi services and private yachts.

HIS HIGHNESS THE RULER OF DUBAI'S COURT

The Ruler's Court building is a prominent mark depicting Dubai's modern cultural heritage and cultural identity. The building is distinguished by its architectural and aesthetic value. An architectural competition was launched for its design in 1984, and was won by the consulting office of John Harris, the well-known British planner who played a major role in preparing the urban plan for Dubai from 1960 to 1970 under the direct supervision of the late Sheikh Rashid bin Saeed Al Maktoum. The project was completed with the opening of the building in 1986 in the Al Fahidi area. The Court's location is linked to Dubai Creek, which is the old city's vibrant artery of history and economy, and is close to the old Al Fardan building, one of the most important historical landmarks in Dubai. It was the Al Fardan Building that played a pivotal role in the history of the emirate as a major centre for receiving sheikhs and official delegations in the 1950s, and the late Sheikh Rashid bin Saeed Al Maktoum preferred holding important meetings and discussions with official State guests and dignitaries. Today, the Diwan is a centre that embodies the spirit of the wise leadership of Dubai's rulers, starting with the late Sheikh Rashid bin Saeed Al Maktoum and continuing with Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Vice President and Prime Minister of the UAE and Ruler of Dubai.

DUBAI MUSEUM

The museum employs life-size dioramas to portray daily life in pre-oil Dubai. Galleries meticulously recreate scenes from the Creek, traditional Arab houses, mosques, the souk, date farms, and the desert, offering a comprehensive depiction of historical Dubai.

AL FAHIDI MUSEUM AND FORT

Dubai Museum Al Fahidi Fort is one of the oldest and most famous museums in Dubai. This museum, located on an area of approximately 4,000 square metres, sheds light on the history of the old city of Dubai in all its entirety. It was used as a fortified fortress to protect the region and the ruling family. Therefore, when you visit this museum, you will be able to learn about the history of the Emirate of Dubai and the old lifestyle embodied in the designs of houses, markets and mosques at that time. The fort dates back to 1787, more than 200 years ago, when it was initially the headquarters of the ruler of the emirate and his family, and then it was used as a defensive centre due to its distinguished location on the borders of the Dubai urban area at the time. The fort underwent restoration work during the reign of the late Sheikh Rashid bin Saeed Al Maktoum (may God bless his soul), and was then opened in 1971 as an official museum to display the history of Dubai and its authentic heritage. In 1995, another new museum was established underground as an addition to the old fort.

INFINITY BRIDGE

Linking the Al Shindagha and Al Ras districts, the Infinity Bridge spans 295 meters over Dubai Creek, rising 15.5 meters high. With 12 lanes and pedestrian crossings, its defining feature is a 42-meter steel arch symbolizing infinity. This magnificent infrastructure adds to Dubai's allure, joining past bridges, including those over Dubai Creek and Dubai Canal, constructed by Six Construct.

BURJ NAHAR PARK

The historic Burj Nahar in Dubai stands tall opposite Dubai Creek, witnessing the story of an emirate whose glory amazed the world. This area continues to inspire and draw into the future that comprehends that nothing is impossible. The tower was built in 1870 from coral and clay stones, and was used for surveillance and warning of any potential attacks from enemies. It is considered one of the few historical forts that have survived, and its purpose was to be the first line of defense against any external attacks. The tower is characterized by being a strong block with no openings on its sides. In 1992, it was reinforced and preserved as a historical and heritage landmark from the history of contemporary Dubai. It is now one of the most prominent tourist attractions that visitors frequent to learn more about the history of the global icon of modernity called Dubai.

NAIF FORT AND POLICE STATION

Naif Fort was built in 1939 by order of the late Sheikh Rashid bin Saeed Al Maktoum (may God bless his soul), and remained the headquarters of the Dubai Police until 1965, when it was moved to its location in Deira. This place was gradually transformed into a global headquarters, characterized by modernity, while reflecting the tremendous development of this venerable institution over the past few decades. In light of the ancient and authentic nature of the fort, now Naif Police Station, the building houses a museum that displays weapons and uniforms worn by Dubai police officers, models of logos, medals, daggers, riot protection equipment, pictures of old and modern Dubai landmarks, and pictures and information about the history of the police. The centre was chosen among the sites approved by His Highness Sheikh Hamdan bin Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, Crown Prince of Dubai, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Defence, as part of the project to protect modern heritage sites and buildings in Dubai, which constitute an important part of its memory and modern history, with the aim of preserving the identity of the emirate and its cultural and urban heritage. The exterior design of Naif Police Station differs from all police stations in Dubai with a modern appearance, because its roots extend deep into the history of the emirate. Hence, care was taken to preserve its original form as close as possible to its origin when it was a fort used as the first headquarters of Dubai Police.

AL AHMADIYA SCHOOL

It is distinguished by its historical importance for its pioneering role in establishing cultural, educational and pedagogical thought in the region, in

general. It is one of the oldest and most prestigious institutions of ancient education and the first semi-regular private school in Dubai. Established in 1912, the school was founded by Sheikh Ahmed bin Dalmouk bin Majid Al Falasi, one of the giants of the pearl trade in the Arabian Gulf. However, he passed away and his son, Sheikh Mohammed bin Ahmed bin Dalmouk, completed it after him, naming it Al Ahmadiya School after his father. Thus began a new era in study and education by attracting an elite group of scholars and jurists to teach religion and the Arabic language. Today, the Dubai Culture and Arts Authority manages the school's heritage site and supervises its organization. In light of the school's historical and educational status, the Dubai Government was keen to restore Al Ahmadiya School in mid-1994 and convert it into a museum that was opened by His Highness Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid Al Maktoum on March 20, 2000.

DUBAI CREEK

Dubai Creek, a saltwater inlet, flows through Dubai's core, connecting the Gulf trading port to Ras al Khor bird sanctuary. Historically, it anchored the fishing and pearling industry, shaping the city's economy. Today, the creek's eastern and western banks link via a tunnel and four bridges, though traditional ferry boats still ply its waters.

DUBAI CREEK YACHT & GOLF CLUB

Established in 1993, Dubai Creek Golf & Yacht Club features an 18-hole par 71 championship golf course and a unique sailshaped clubhouse. It houses the region's inaugural golf academy and various function rooms, changing facilities, and restaurants. Situated on the Deira side of Dubai Creek, it epitomizes the heart of the city. The yacht club, housed separately, is designed to resemble an Arabian tent, envisioned by British architect Brian Johnson.

MOHAMMED BIN RASHID AL MAKTOUM LIBRARY

The Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum Library is one of the most distinctive buildings in the Middle East. Designed in the shape of a saddle, which is a book support with the Holy Quran in its arms, the library building was designed and commissioned to meet the city's commitments in terms of environmental conservation and the highest standards of sustainability. The external structure was designed to insulate the interior of the building, reduce heat gain and help regulate the internal environment of the building, and it enjoys natural lighting thanks to the roof windows in the building. The modern library is located on the banks of Dubai Creek in the Jaddaf area, with a total area of 54,000 square metres. It houses more than 4 million books and an exceptional collection of documents, references, articles, newspapers, publications, presentations, documentaries and lectures. The library also embodies Dubai's cultural facade and provides electronic linking services with the most important international libraries to exchange valuable and rare information, in addition to an integrated

database that includes electronic copies of all the library's contents. The library consists of seven floors and includes eight libraries (the public library, the periodicals library, the children's library, the youth library, the maps and Atlases library, the arts and media library, the business library, the Emirates library and the special collections library) in addition to the information centre. The seventh floor is allocated solely for exhibitions.

DUBAI FESTIVAL CITY

It is a luxurious residential and tourist project and a large shopping centre that includes a waterfront on Dubai Creek, a number of car and supplies sales centres, as well as a number of hotels, schools and a golf course. The project covers an area of 5.2 million square feet and is described as a city within a city, as it houses upscale residential and tourist areas.

MUSHRIF PARK

Established in 1974, Mushrif Park is one of the oldest parks in Dubai, covering an area of 125 hectares. In 1992, the park was expanded to include an additional area of 320 hectares, to be transformed into a natural forest: Currently, the park has been planted with more than 70,000 trees of different species that are in line with the local nature of the emirate, in addition to the natural trees found in the area. The park also includes a mountain walking trail with a total length of 9.7 km.

DUBAI SAFARI

Dubai Safari combines entertainment and education in a unique natural environment that simulates the original habitats of animals. It was opened in December 2017, and extends over a vast area of up to 119 hectares. The safari includes more than 2,500 animals from about 250 different species, including rare and endangered species such as the white rhinoceros, white lion, Bengal tiger and gorillas. The park is divided into several areas such as the African Safari, the Asian Safari, and the Arabian Village, and each area expresses a specific geographical environment, giving visitors an exceptional and unique experience. One of the most prominent features of Dubai Safari is the presence of a beautiful artificial lake and modern environmentally friendly facilities that are operated using solar energy, in addition to interactive animal shows and tours in air-conditioned cars designed with the highest safety standards. The safari aims to promote environmental awareness and preserve biodiversity through breeding and reproduction programmes for rare species. Dubai Safari is a fun family destination that combines fun and knowledge in a lively environment.

HAMDAN SPORTS COMPLEX

Experience a versatile sports and events facility with a 15,000-seat arena and two Olympic-standard swimming pools, often repurposed for various events like karate and basketball tournaments. Amenities include gyms, saunas, and jacuzzis for all

The walls of the fort were built out of mud bricks and cob, palm tree trunks were used for ceilings and gypsum for details. It is a square fort, looking much like a typical castle. It has round towers on 3 of its corners. This is almost exactly the same design as Attab Fort and Al Jabbana Fort. Why the 4th corner was left without a tower, I don't know. Apparently the threat was being expected from the south, as the south wall of all the 3 forts has 2 towers. The entrance is always in either the west or east wall.

LAST KM

The final climb winds through wide-ranging hairpin bends on a 3-lane roadway. Gradients are mainly around 8-9% with a peak of 11%, 3 km from the finish. There is a very short descent in the last km, before the last ramp. The finish line is on straight asphalt.

AL AIN QUASR AL MUWAIJI

A historic fort that served as the birthplace of Sheikh Khalifa bin Zayed Al Nahyan, former President of the UAE. This beautifully restored fort now houses a museum celebrating Al Ain's rich heritage and the leadership of the UAE.

AL JAHILI FORT

Al Jahili Fort is one of the UAE's most historic buildings. It was erected in 1891 to defend the city and protect precious palm groves. The former headquarters of the Oman Trucial Scouts, the force that protected the mountain passes and kept inter-tribal peace, it also served as a residence for the local governor. It is set in beautifully landscaped gardens, and visitors are encouraged to explore it.

AL AIN OASIS

In the heart of the city, the Al Ain Oasis has been opened as the UAE's first curated UNESCO World Heritage site visitor experience. Spread over 1,200 hectares (nearly 3,000 acres) and containing more than 147,000 date palms of up to 100 different varieties, this impressive oasis is filled with palm plantations, many of which are still working farms. The cool, shady walkways transport you from the heat and noise of the city to a tranquil haven; all you will hear is birdsong and the rustle of the palm fronds. The site introduces visitors to the delicate oasis eco-system and the importance it has played in the development of the emirate. The oasis landscape of Al Ain is shaped by a complex shared water supply based on both wells and 'afraj', the UAE's traditional irrigation system. Al Ain Oasis has plenty of working examples of the falaj which have been used for centuries to tap into underground wells.

AL AIN PALACE MUSEUM

Located on the western edge of Al Ain Oasis, the Palace of the late Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan was built in 1937. It was converted into a museum in 1998 and opened to the public in 2001. The original structure comprised a private residence for the ruler and his family within a complex of courtyards. The architectural design and construction of Al Ain Palace is typical of historical buildings of the UAE. It features the characteristic ventilation structures that are designed to keep the buildings cool in the summer. Locally sourced and

environmentally friendly building materials were used, including clay, adobe and plaster stones, as well as palm tree elements for roofing rooms, ceilings, doors and windows. The use of teak was later introduced in the renovation of the buildings.

SOUQ AL QATTARA

Dating back to the mid-20th century and founded by the late Sheikh Shakhbut bin Sultan Al Nahyan on the palm-lined road linking Al Ain's Al Qattara and Al Jimi oases, the historic Souq Al Qattara has been renovated and re-opened. A traditional handicrafts market takes place here every Thursday, Friday and Saturday from October to May, encouraging local families to preserve and promote Abu Dhabi's heritage through an active involvement in traditional craft production. The Souq is linked to the redeveloped Al Qattara Fort, now home to a popular arts center, featuring hundreds of modern exhibits, workshops, a café and a library.

AL QATTARA ARTS CENTRE

What was originally the Al Qattara Fort is today the Al Qattara Arts Centre. This traditional mud-brick tower and house is located on a mound overlooking the date-palm gardens of Qattara Oasis, which it was originally built to protect. Showcasing carefully restored traditional local architecture, the centre aims to provide a family-friendly venue where arts and culture can be studied, practiced, and developed by the entire UAE community and visiting travellers.

HAZZA BIN ZAYED STADIUM

The home of Al Ain FC, this 25,000-seat stadium is one of Al Ain's tallest buildings and a recognizable landmark. The outer façade design of this stadium is inspired by a palm tree trunk, an integral part of the UAE's heritage and culture. The stadium is part of a wider project, constructed in phases, which will ultimately include residential, commercial, and entertainment areas, as well as a luxury hotel and sports facilities.

UAE UNIVERSITY

United Arab Emirates University is the oldest university in the United Arab Emirates. It was established in 1976. The UAEU is an accredited research-based institution. Its alumni have provided the United Arab Emirates with ministers, diplomats, senior government officials, and business leaders.

SHEIKH KHALIFA BIN ZAYED GRAND MOSQUE

The Sheikh Khalifa Bin Zayed Grand Mosque, also known as Al Ain Grand Mosque, will be able to accommodate 20,000 worshippers. It is composed of a basement

level and ground floor and will also include a 160-meter- wide dome that will cover the main prayer hall and four 60-metre-tall minarets. The complex will also include other buildings for classrooms and offices, as well as underground parking.

AL AIN ZOO

This 900-hectare park near the base of Jebel Hafeet is where visitors can see a large animal collection in enclosures that closely resemble their natural habitats. There are plenty of green public spaces for picnics and playgrounds, a cafeteria, and a train tour of the wildlife area. The Al Ain Zoo is home to over 4,000 animals, with at least 30% of its 180 species considered endangered. Conservation efforts have been strengthened by partnerships with San Diego Zoo, the Fairchild Tropical Botanical Garden in Miami, and the World Association of Zoos & Aquariums.

GREEN MUBAZZARAH

Strategically located at the feet of the Jebel Hafeet Mountains, Green Mubazzarah is home to a number of spending Chalets that make a great retreat away from the noise of the metropolis providing guests with a deluxe lodging and intimate access to the great outdoors. Green Mubazzarah occupies part of the rocky mountain side and been landscaped with rolling grassy hillsides alongside streams, hot springs and waterfalls. Green Mubazzarah Chalets is less than a 40 minute-drive from Al Ain International Airport and 15 minute- drive from Wadi Adventure.

JEBEL HAFEET

Rising 1,240 meters, Jebel Hafeet is the emirate's highest peak, and the UAE's second. This towering rocky mountain, which stands guard over Al Ain and borders Oman, is forged out of craggy limestone that has been weathered over millions of years. Significant fossil discoveries have been made in the area, which are vital pieces in the jigsaw on the city's ancient history. Over 500 ancient burial tombs dating back 5,000 years have been found in the Jebel Hafeet foothills. Once you reach the top, you'll be rewarded with magnificent views over Al Ain.

QASR AL MUWAIJI

For more than 100 years, this incredible historic fort has played a major role in the history of the United Arab Emirates. The Qasr Al Muwaiji fort was built in the early 20th century to protect and watch over the oasis, and is a great place to take photos today. The simple yet impressive square enclosure features a grand entrance gate and protruding corner towers. Over the years, Qasr Al Muwaiji has been used as a home for the ruling family, a place for the community to gather, and as a seat of governance.

HILI ARCHAEOLOGICAL PARK

If history fascinates you, then you'll want to add Hili Archaeological Park to your itinerary. Now a modern park where you're able to picnic and go for peaceful walks, this UNESCO World Heritage site dates back to the Bronze Age and includes evidence of settlements dating back to about 2000 BCE, with ancient tombs. Also visit the nearby Hili 8 where, in 1977, French archaeologists began excavating and found the remains of barley, wheat, and date palm as well as bronze objects, pottery, and livestock. Today, you'll find ancient tombs, built with the utmost care, and exposed building foundations.

BAIT MOHAMMED BIN KHALIFA

A unique cultural destination within a beautifully restored historic home, now a community space for all.

AL MURABBA POLICE MUSEUM

A museum in Al Ain, Emirate of Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates, that explores the heritage of the police force in the UAE. There are a number of items in its gallery that showcase the equipment and effects of the different police forces that have existed throughout history, as well as a variety of information describing and explaining them.

AIN AL FAYDA

Ain Al Faydah lies on the southern end of Al Ain, bordering Jebel Hafeet Mountains to the east. It is a mixed-use community featuring residential plots and villas along with a resort and amenities such as restaurants, mosques, parks and retail outlets.

ART. 1 - ORGANIZATION

ABU DHABI SPORTS COUNCIL and DUBAI SPORTS COUNCILS call and organize, in cooperation with RCS SPORTS AND EVENTS DMCC (Fortune Executive Tower, JLT, Cluster T - P.O. Box: 24883 - Dubai, United Arab Emirates - T. +971 44058800), website www.theuaetour.com, the UAE TOUR WOMEN an international cycling stage race on the international UCI WOMEN WORLDTOUR calendar (2.WWT), in compliance with the International Cycling Union regulations.

The race will start in Dubai on Thursday 6th February and finish in Abu Dhabi Sunday 9th February 2025 according to the following program:

The technical guide of the UAE tour Women 2025 details each stage, timetables, start and finish sites, distances in kilometres together with the relevant stage routemaps and profiles.

The race director, subject to prior notification to the PCP UCI, can change the timetables and/or itineraries, if need be, giving prior notice to the interested parties. (Article 2.2.029 UCI) Furthermore, he might summon the representatives for the "Extreme Weather Protocol" in compliance with article 2.2.029 bis UCI. In such a situation, decisions can be taken and/or confirmed on the morning of the stage (See the "Extreme Weather Protocol").



The Emirati Marshals Program is a professional sports volunteering program aimed at empowering youth and fostering a culture of sports volunteering.

The program maintains a database of over 35,000 marshals with extensive experience in organizing sports events.

The marshals contribute to the organization of more than 130 sports events across the country during the 2024/2025 sports season, with the participation of over 19,000 volunteers.

The Emirati Marshals Program collaborates with the Abu Dhabi Sports Council to organize the UAE Tour for the ninth consecutive year, involving more than 1,000 volunteers.



REGULATIONS

ART. 2 – TYPE OF RACE

The race is reserved to Women Elite/U23 Category and points will be awarded for the “UCI Individual World Ranking”, according to the provisions set out in Articles 2.10.011 and 2.10.017 UCI.

ART. 3 – ENROLLMENT

According to Article 2.1.005 and 2.1.007 bis UCI, the race is reserved to: UCI Women's WorldTeams, UCI women's continental teams, UCI cyclo-cross professional teams, National Team of the host country. In compliance with Article 2.2.003 UCI, the number of Riders per team shall be 6 (six).

In any case, the Organization, so as to safeguard the image and the reputation of its race, reserves the right to reject, up to the start, the Riders or the Teams which, by their acts or statements, would prove to neglect the principles of sport fair play and the undertaken commitments as set forth in Article 1.1.023 UCI.

Furthermore, in the event the Riders or the Team should fail during the race in complying with the principles set out in the foregoing paragraph, the Organization shall also reserve the right to expel them from the race at any time, in compliance with the Article 2.2.010 bis UCI.

ART. 4 – GENERAL PROVISIONS

The subjects listed hereunder are liable for the enforcement of the present regulations and – for all that is not regulated under the present ruling – of the current regulations issued by the International Cycling Union:

- the titular race Riders;
- the Sports Directors and the Teams' staff;
- all the Race's followers duly accredited by the Organizers in a recognized and acknowledged official position.

Only the persons notified upon getting the identification badge by the owners of the authorized vehicles are entitled to follow the race. Each and every change or addition shall be notified to the Organization Manager. The cars and motorcycles' drivers shall comply not only with the enforced rules of the Highway Code, but also with the provisions issued by the Organization Manager and his staff. Persons without any function acknowledged by the Organizers or relevant to the race's services as well as under-aged persons are not allowed to follow the race.

In the event of non-compliance about “the circulation during the race” will apply to the articles of the Part 2 Road Races, Chapter 2, paragraph 4, UCI regulations.

The Organizing Society shall not be accountable for any damage caused by accidents or incidents before, during and after the race to spectators or people in general, even if not involved in the race itself, because of actions that have not been performed by the Organization itself.

For all that is not regulated under the present ruling, the regulations issued by the UCI are enforced.

ART. 5 - RIGHTS AND DUTIES OF RIDERS

All registered Riders have the right, in compliance with the regulations in force, to compete in all the classifications – i.e. stage classification, general and special classifications – inscribed in the race programme.

They are required to maintain a responsible race behavior and to refrain from promoting or supporting any mass demonstration susceptible to assume the character of either fraudulent agreements prejudicing other Competitors, or to appear as a protest against the Organizing Society or the Commissaires' Panel or other official followers whatsoever.

Moreover, the titular Riders are requested:

A) to carry a frame number and two body numbers duly provided by the Organization. These numbers cannot be modified as far as their size is concerned (Articles.1.3.076/077 UCI)

B) to carry on all the stages a transponder supplied by the Organization and to be affixed on the frame of the bicycle, for the automatic reading of their passage position on the finish line and in some other segments determined by the Organization. However, the crossing of the finish line will be the final reference for the stage classification. Failure in complying with such obligation shall be considered as an infringement equivalent to the absence of body number and consequently punished in accordance with UCI Table 2.12.007/3.5.3

C) to wear the jersey corresponding to their relevant team as well as the World Championship or National Championship jerseys; in order of priority in compliance of the Article 1.3.071 UCI.

D) the leaders of the General Classification, the Points Classification, the Best Young Rider Classification, the Intermediate Sprints Classification, shall respectively wear the Red jersey, the Green jersey, the White jersey, the Black jersey, all of them duly provided by the Organizing Society. This order also features the priority between the different leader's distinctive jerseys, so that in the case a Rider should be leading more than one classification, he would wear the distinctive jersey having a priority in the above-mentioned order. The remaining jerseys would be put on, at an honorific title, by the next following Riders in the ranking of the respective classifications, provided that they are not already entitled to a different classification (Article 2.6.018 UCI). The jersey-holder is required to wear his distinctive garment beginning from the signature procedure until to the prize-giving ceremony and during any possible press conference;

E) to refrain from answering to interviews during the race.

REGULATIONS

F) to quickly leave the left side (or right only if safer) of the road free for motorcycles and vehicles authorized to overtake the peloton;

G) in case of drop-out in the course of the race, to remit the body number to a Commissaire or to the “Broom wagon”.

H) to refrain – after having crossed the finish line – from crossing the line a second time while still wearing his body number, and thus until the finish judge or the finish Commissaire in charge authorize the crossing (UCI Table 2.12.007/1.6)

I) The General Classification leader and the stage winner shall show up at the press room or the for a press conference with the accredited journalists (Article 2.2.082 UCI).

J) to undergo the Anti-Doping procedure, the convened Riders shall go to the premises indicated by the Organizer.

K) to behave appropriately with a respectable behavior in line with the local tradition and regulations, using all the carefulness necessary. For example, riders shall use structures that the organizer will provide like changing rooms and bathrooms in all start and finish areas.

To pay particular attention to the environment while disposing of trash and empty bottles.

ART. 6 – RACE HEADQUARTERS

The official accreditations and preliminary operations will take place in Abu Dhabi on the premises of Radisson Blu Hotel - YAS Island – YAS Plaza from 10:00 to 18:00 on Wednesday 5th February 2025.

The confirmation of the starting Riders and the collection of the race numbers by the Sports Directors is set at the Race Headquarters on 5th February from 16:00 to 16:45, subsequently at 17:00 at the Race Headquarters is due to take place the Meeting with the Organization Management, the Commissaires Panel, the Sports Directors and with the presence of UCI Technical Delegate, according to the provisions set out in Articles 1.2.087-88/2.2.093 UCI.

On 5th February at 10:30, the Race Director with the President of Commissaires’Panel will hold “Race security briefing” for all Drivers, cars and motorcycles, which will be involved in the race convoy, with the Representative of the television production and with the Representative of the Highway Police, see Article 2.2.034 bis UCI.

ART. 7 – PRELIMINARY OPERATIONS AT THE START

For each stage, in the Technical Guide, is mentioned the start meeting point. The Riders are required to turn up at the Podium for signature check. (Article 2.3.009 UCI),in

complete Team line-up according a pre-scheduled order which will be communicated the day before with the official communication.

Then, Riders, in peloton, will gather for the transfert towards km.0.

ART. 8 - TOP-RIDERS PHOTOSHOOTING AND TEAM PRESENTATION

The protocols Organizer may set Top-Riders photoshooting and their press conference, Organization will communicate the list of riders. Teams will make available the Top-Riders requested with the support of team press officer.

All the Teams, with all their Riders and two Team Managers and/or Sports Directors shall take part in the opening and teams presentation ceremony in case it will be organized.

ART. 9 – RADIO INFORMATION

Race news will be broadcasted on the frequency VHF 149.850 MHz. Organizers will provide the radio for every car in the race and to all vehicles or person shall need it.

ART. 10 – TIMEKEEPING

The Timekeepers Service, with the assistance of the finish judge, will be in charge of recording the official time. The service will be guarantee by EMG Italy SpA. Riders will be provided with a trasponder, for the automatic reading of their time, to be affixed on the frame of the bicycle compulsarily.

ART. 11 – TIME BONUSES

Time Bonus valid for the General Individual Classification are envisaged in each stage. According to the article 2.6.019 UCI, the time bonuses will be as follows:

- for each Intermediate sprint the time bonuses for the first three riders crossing the line will be respectively 3’, 2” and 1”
- upon finishing each stage respectively 10”, 6” and 4” time bonuses will be assigned to the first three riders crossing the line.

ART. 12 SIGNPOSTS

The Organizing Society, under the supervision of the Safety Manager, shall place the necessary signposts along the race route.

For each stage, detailed information about safety and about the road’s situation will be provided in the “Daily Race Communiqués”.

ART. 13 FEEDING

Fixed "Feed Zones" will be set up every 30-40 km depending on the route characteristic and will be preceded and followed by "Litter Zones" as per article 2.3.025 UCI. The zones will be signposted along the race route and listed in the time schedules. Organization is committed to collect all the waste referred to the race and invites all the suiveurs to behave in way respectful of environment safeguard.

ART. 14 – TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE

The technical assistance service is provided for by 3 vehicles of the SHIMANO company.

ART. 15 – MEDICAL SERVICE

The Medical Service appointed by the Race Manager, is provided by an adequate number of Doctors and Paramedics; the service is operative during the race and available before the start and after the finish of the race. In case of need, following ambulances coordinated by the race Doctors will take the Riders to the hospitals mentioned in the Technical Guide.

ART. 16 – STAGE FINISHES

Stage finishes shall be announced in advance by a red triangle located one kilometer from the finish line and by an arch in coincidence with the time keeping and photo finish line. It is mandatory for all vehicles to perform a detour from the race route where indicated by the Organizer, in order not to cross the finish line, exception for the Race Management, the Commissaires' Panel and the official Doctor vehicles, article 2.3.006 UCI.

In the case of a crash, puncture or mechanical incident beyond the signpost indicating the finish within three kilometres, the rider(s) affected shall be credited with the time of the group in whose company he was (they were) when the accident occurred, in compliance with Article 2.6.027 UCI.

The rule does not apply to stages featuring a summit finish (3rd). For all that is not regulated under this ruling, the irrevocable decision taken by the Commissaires' Panel in consultation with the Organization Management shall apply.

The "Protocol for stages expected to finish in bunch sprints" will be enforced in stages 1, 2 and 4 for calculating time gaps.

ART. 17 – FINISHING TIME LIMIT

In order to determine the finishing time limit, the stages have been divided into three categories depending on the different nature of their route:

- A category: stages presenting no particular difficulty (Stage 1, 2 and 4)
- B category: stages presenting difficulty (Stage 3)

REGULATIONS

Consequently, the time limit has been set out as follows:

- for the A category the winner's time plus:
 - 16% if the average speed is less than or equal to 39 Km/h.
 - 17% if the average speed is between 39 and 42 Km/h
 - 19% if the average speed is over 42 Km/h
- for the B category the winner's time plus:
 - 22% if the average speed is less than or equal to 34 km/h
 - 23% if the average speed is between 34 and 37 km/h
 - 25% if the average speed is over 37 km/h

According to Article 2.6.032 UCI, in case of exceptional circumstances, confirmed accidents or incidents, the Commissaires Panel, after consultation with the Organization Manager, may readmit in the race any Rider finishing in a time exceeding the time limit, by increasing the latter by a maximum of 30% of the time set out in this article. The time limit, established on the basis of the winner's time expressed in minute seconds, shall be further rounded off to the successive superior minute.

In case, for those Riders readmitted, all points awarded in the general classification of the various secondary classifications shall be withdrawn.

ART. 18 – PENALTIES

Infringements will be sanctioned according to UCI Rules and to the "Table of race incidents" (2.12.007).

ART. 19 – PRIZE-GIVING PROTOCOL

After every stage finish, the stage winner, the leader of the General Classification who receives the red jersey, the leader of the General Classification by Points who receives the green jersey, the leader of the Best Young Rider Classification who receives the white jersey and the leader of the Intermediate Sprints Classification who receives the black jersey shall attend the prize-giving ceremony.

Moreover, the stage winner and the leader of the General Classification shall participate in the press conference for the accredited journalists. (Article 1.2.112/113 UCI)

ART. 20 – ANTI-DOPING

Antidoping Control will be made on the dedicated premises by the finish area. The Doping Control Officer (DCO) charged by the ITA and acting on behalf of UCI will

enforce the UCI Regulations, in compliance with the ITA's instructions and procedures, in accordance with Chapter 14 of the UCI ADR-TIR (Testing Investigation Rules) and with the relevant Law in force of the hosting country.

ART. 21 – GENERAL INDIVIDUAL CLASSIFICATION BY TIME

The Leader of the General Individual Classification will wear the Red jersey. In compliance with the provisions set out in Article 2.6.014 UCI, the General Individual Classification is established by adding together the times achieved by each rider in each stage. Time bonuses and penalties are considered for this classification. In the event of a tie in the General Individual Classification the discriminating criteria is given by the lower sum of the placing obtained in each stage, as a last resort, the place obtained in the final stage is counted (Article 2.6.015 UCI).

ART. 22 – GENERAL INDIVIDUAL CLASSIFICATION BY POINTS

The sum of the points will determine an individual ranking and every day its Leader will wear the Green jersey. The individual points ranking is obtained by adding together the points recorded in each of the four stages and the sum of the points assigned in all the Intermediate Sprints.

At each Intermediate Sprint points are awarded as follows:

1 st	8 points
2 nd	5 points
3 rd	3 points
4 th	1 point

At each finish of the four stages points are awarded as follows:

1 st	20 points
2 nd	16 points
3 rd	12 points
4 th	9 points
5 th	7 points
6 th	5 points
7 th	4 points
8 ^v	3 points
9 th	2 points
10 th	1 point

REGULATIONS

According to the provisions set out in Article 2.6.017 UCI, in the event of a tie in the General Classification by Points the following criteria will be applied:

1. Number of stage victories
2. Number of Intermediate Sprint victories
3. General Individual Classification

To receive the prizes of the final General Classification Riders will have to complete the Race.

ART. 23 – BEST YOUNG RIDER

The Best Young Classification is reserved to Riders born after 1st January 2002 and is determined by the General individual Classification. The Leader will wear the White jersey

ART. 24 – “INTERMEDIATE SPRINT JERSEY” CLASSIFICATION

A special Intermediate Sprint Classification has been set up, at each Intermediate Sprint points are awarded as follows:

1 st	8 points
2 nd	5 points
3 rd	3 points
4 rd	1 points

The general ranking is established by the sum of the points obtained; the Leader of the Intermediate Sprint Classification shall wear the Black jersey.

In the event of a tie in the Intermediate Sprint general classification, the following discriminating criteria will be applied:

- number of Intermediate Sprint victories
- general individual classification

To receive the prizes of the final General Classification Riders will have to complete the Race.

ART. 25 – TEAM CLASSIFICATION

According to the provisions set out in Article 2.06.016 UCI, the team classification is established on the basis of the sum of the three best individual times from each team. In the event of a tie the teams shall be separated by the sum of the places acquired by

their three best times in the stage. If the teams are still tied, they shall be separated by the placing of their best rider on the stage classification. The team general classification shall be calculated on the basis of the three best individual times from each team in each stage ridden.

In the event of a tie the following criteria shall be applied in order until the teams are separated:

- number of first places in the daily team classifications;
- number of second places in the daily team classifications;
- etc.

If there is still a draw, the teams shall be separated by the placing of their best Rider in the general individual classification. Any team reduced to fewer than three riders shall be eliminated from the general team classification.

ART. 26 – RACE MANAGEMENT

The UAE Tour race will be managed in compliance with the UCI regulations through the UCI Commissaires appointed according to the art. 1.1.070 and in collaboration with the RCS Sports technical race management coordinated by the race directors Mauro Vegni (tel. +39 02 258 48 766) and Stefano Allocchio (mob. +39 335 6971 197).

ART. 27 – REGULAR AND SPECIAL PRIZES

The UAE Tour offers the following regular and special prizes:

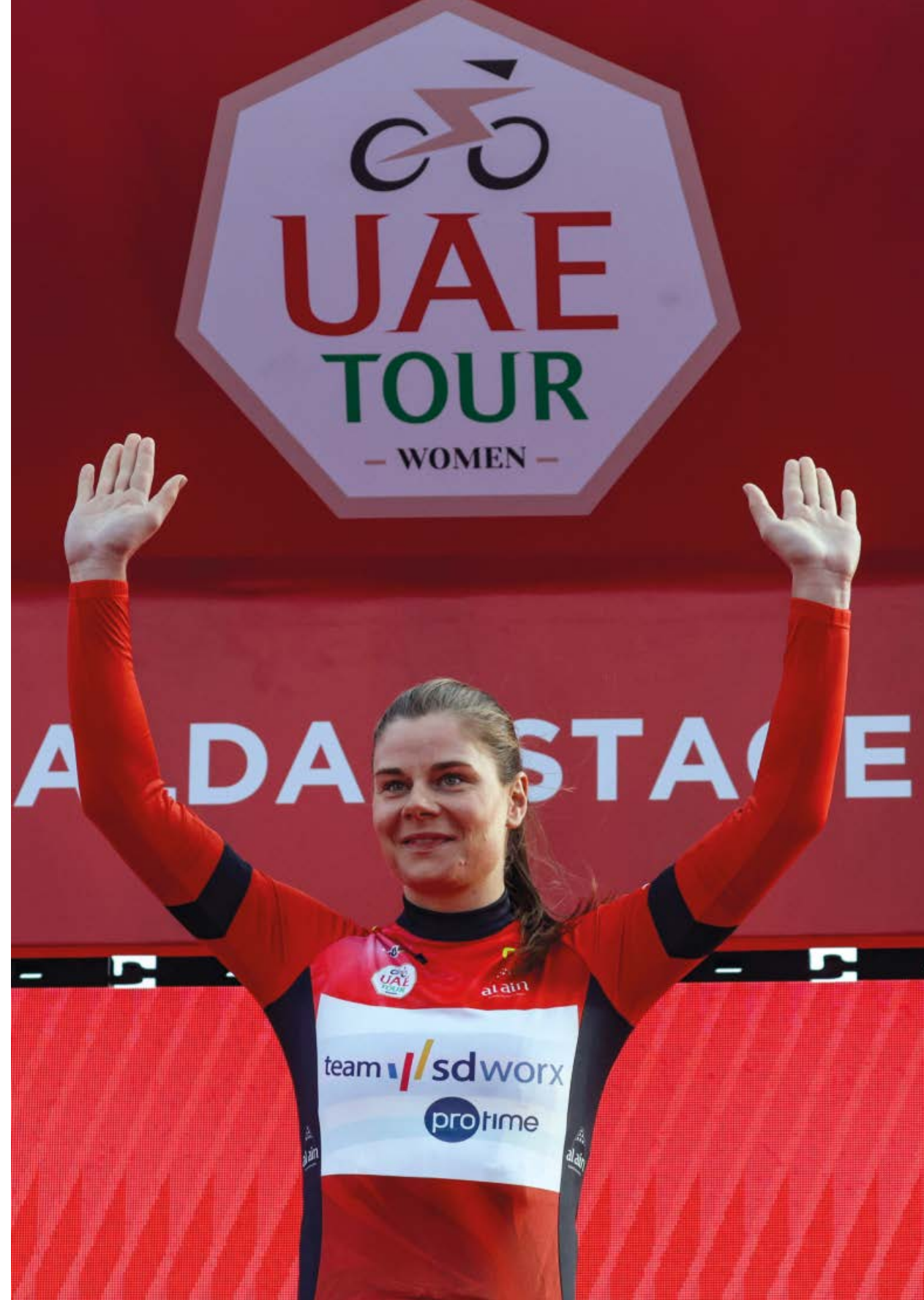
